Governor Ganduje Equips 50 ERC's in Kano State



The Kano State Governor, Abdullahi Umar Ganduje has equipped 50 NIMC enrollment Centres in the State in order to assist in making the National Identification Number (NIN) enrollment exercise a success.

This was disclosed by the Kano State Coordinator, Muhammad Auwal Sanusi while addressing Journalists at the State Office.

Sanusi assured Journalists of improved service delivery to citizens particularly Kano state residents with this development.

He also expressed the Commission's gratitude to the Kano State Government for their support in ensuring NIMC's mandate is fulfilled, and urged Citizens and legal residents in Kano State to enroll for the NIN as it is mandatory for identification, authentication and verification as well as accessing social benefits and conducting other transactions.

Sanusi also assured Journalists that the commission was fully equipped for the enrollment of citizens and legal residents in Kano state into the National Identity Database.

Over 55,000 IDPs Enrolled in Borno

The National Identity Management Commission (NIMC) has registered over 55,000 Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) into the National Identity Database,

NIMC in Collaboration with UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) launched a registration exercise in December 2017, to register 100,000 IDPs in Borno Sate for the purpose of identification, authentication, and verification in order to access social benefits with ease.

This success can be attributed to the dedication and resilience of enrollment officers at the IDP enrollment Center in Borno State, especially the special intervention team deployed from NIMC headquarters, Yobe and Gombe state.

Kudos to the team members; Ajayi Oluwaseun, Aliyu Yusuf Ahmed and Auwal Ahmed who collectively surpassed expectations, recording over 100 successful enrolments per day, individually. Indeed they are worthy of emulation by all enrollment officers.
