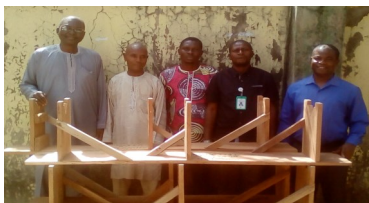




Christian Fellowship Donates Benches to NIMC Taraba
